




#### **Cast Biographies**



Adrian Arteaga (Prince Harry of Monmouth) — Adrian is a student at the University of Texas at Arlington majoring in performance. He has been seen many times on the Theatre Rocks! stage since first appearing in the 2017 production of Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs as "Sir Dandiprat Bombas." He directed last season's productions of A Christmas Story and The Secret Garden, and was most recently seen on the Theatre Rocks! stage as "Arnold Wiggins" in this season's opening production of The Boys Next Door. He played "William Talvas" in The Ashes of Aquitaine, "Lieutenant Reuben Twist" in Mojave. "Jesus" in the 2018 world premiere as well as last year's production of Hyer House. He appeared as "Lloyd Barnett" in Crimes of the Heart, as "Mr. Carrisford" in A Little Princess, and twice as "Bob Cratchit" in the holiday show, A Christmas Carol. He would like to thank all his family and friends for the continued support.



Mike L. Hall (Bradmore) – Raised in the East Texas town of Mabank, Mike grew up using his imagination since small-town life didn't offer much in way of entertainment. Raised by his grandparents, he graduated from Mabank High School in 1987 and went to college at Trinity Valley Community College. It was after college that Mike discovered theater and was hooked. Some of his stage credits include "Mr. Gilmer" in To Kill A Mockingbird, "George Bailey" in It's A Wonderful Life, and "Mr. Van Daan" in The Diary of Anne Frank. He also has appeared in the Theatre Rocks! productions of *The Secret Garden*, *A Christmas* Story, Mojave, Skin Deep (Best Actor), The Traveling Lady (Best Performance), My Favorite Christmas, Cabin Fever, and The Ashes of Aquitaine. In the last several years, Mike has been more involved in film/television work and writing, appearing in the films Something in the Woods, Devil's Deal, Loveland, and The Alamo. as well as TVshows Dallas, Chase, Gilmore Girls, and The Practice. He recently won the Best Screenplay Award at the Lake Charles Film Festival with his comedy screenplay My Dad, Arlo and Me.



## Bill Rhoten Theatre Rocks! Co-Founder and Artistic Director

Bill Rhoten was born in Ft. Walton Beach, Florida, and raised in Corpus Christi, Texas. He has more than 40 years of diversified acting, directing, producing, and writing experience, in over 100 stage productions in Ennis and the Dallas area. He founded Dallas Theatre on Tour, the Prairie House Dinner Theatre, Ennis Public Theatre, and — eight years ago — Theatre Rocks! Some career highlights include:

directing Pulitzer Prize and Tony winner Tracy Letts in his early career in Dallas in four productions; Bill performed in and directed William Mastrosimone's *The Woolgatherer*, for which he received the coveted "Critics Choice" award by the Dallas Times Herald; he directed *Electric Angel* by Brad Bailey, which had its world premiere in Dallas and was later produced in Los Angeles; and *The Real Queen of Hearts Ain't Even Pretty* by Brad Bailey was produced twice by Bill, who later coproduced and directed the feature length film.

His writing credits include two screenplays, a TV pilot, *Jessle's Dlary*, a short film now available on Amazon.com, and his film entitled *New Hope* (writer/director) which was selected with 30 other shorts in its category (of 1,800 submitted) for competition at the Palm Springs International Film Festival. "*New Hope* was the wisest, the smartest, and truthfully the most passionate of all the films we submitted....." (The Desert Sun, Palm Springs, California)

He has authored eight stage plays: My Favorite Christmas, Where's Santa?, and Life's Little Miracles, as well as five award-winning plays, all of which premiered on the Theatre Rocks! stage: Mojave, Hyer House, My First Date, Forever, and KFLU Floydada, Country that's Contagious.

Suzanne's background is in film and theatre production. She was formerly a founder and executive director of the Miss Plano Pageant, a preliminary to the Miss Texas/Miss America pageants. 


